Court Decision and Veto Raise

Eyebrows in Tallahassee on Procurement Issue The veto of a major bill relating to State Financial Matters has not stymied legislators' demands for changes in the state's procurement practices. Expect attention to significant changes in Florida's procurement laws next session.
