The annual publication reports on historical trends captured since the survey's inception 12 years ago and includes information related to emerging issues in class action litigation. The results of this

year's survey of in-house attorneys at some of the largest companies in the U.S. indicate that companies expect more labor and employment and consumer fraud class claims. The survey also highlights the continued growth in legal expenses and describes in-house counsel's efforts to manage those expenses while not compromising on a defense. - Review the type and frequency of class actions reported in the survey.
